How does a Dual Credit Program Work?

During Semester 2 of the 2016-2017 School Year, you will participate in a combination of co-op education and Level 1 Apprenticeship training at the Owen Sound Campus of Georgian College.

220 Hours = 2 co-op/ OYAP Credits

360 Hours = 3 Dual Credits

Students Must:

- Have 25 secondary school credits with all compulsory credits completed by the end of Semester 1 of Grade 12
- Participate in a competitive interview with Georgian College faculty, OYAP Staff and potential employers

*** in 2015 OYAP interviewed over 40 students

- Earn a mark of at least 60% in each class at Georgian College to be credited for Level 1 theory of the trade.
- Work the number of hours required to earn two credits

How much does this course cost?

As a student, this course is absolutely free of charge. You will have transportation to and from the college provided, uniforms for when you are in the kitchen along with tools to help make you successful! You are even exempt from Georgian College Tuition Fees!

Secondary school students will:

- Earn five credits in semester 2
- Register as an apprentice and earn apprenticeship hours
- Complete the Cook Level 1 Apprenticeship curriculum at the Owen Sound campus, gaining three credits applicable to their high school diploma
- Gain an early orientation to college life and academic expectations

How Do I Apply?

- Speak to your Guidance Counsellor to be sure your compulsory credits will be completed by end of Semester 1, January 2017.
- Submit an application form before **Monday, November 2, 2016.**
- Attend a mandatory information session
