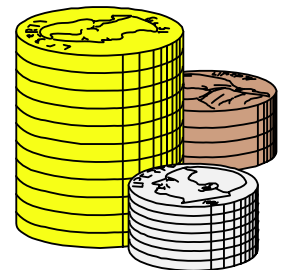

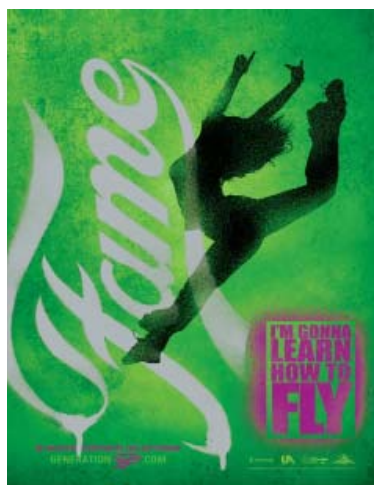

## Track and Field Team

The track and field team has experienced great success this season. In early May, the team competed at the Good Times Meet in Port Elgin as a warm-up to the qualifying meets. By mid-May, 22 of our athletes were competing at the Bluewater Athletic Assoc. Championship with 15 athletes qualifying for the next level of competition. These athletes qualified for CWOSSA in 21 individual events and 2 relays. Approximately 65 schools compete at the CWOSSA level for entry into the OFSSA West Regional Track and Field Meet. Sacred Heart is proud to have Colin Black advance to the OFSSA West Regional Meet in Windsor. Colin competed in the junior boys' long jump finishing in 5<sup>th</sup> place. Although Colin was not among the top 4 jumpers who will advance to the OFSSA Championships, he achieved a personal best jump of 6.29 metres (one centimetre less than the 4<sup>th</sup> place jumper).
