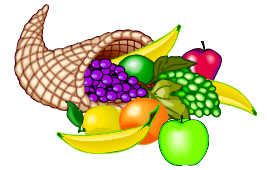

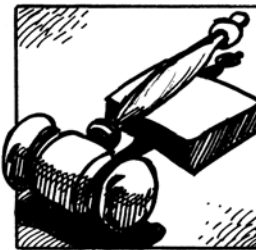

EQAO RESULTS

Individual results from the 2009-2010 EQAO Grade 9 Math Testing were mailed earlier this week. Our students performed well on the testing. A summary of our school results are outlined in the charts below:

Grade 9 Academic Level Math:

Students enrolled in Grade 9 Academic Math (MPM 1D1) or Grade 9 Applied Math (MFM 1P1) this semester will write the EQAO Grade 9 Math Test in their regular math class during the week of January 17th.

SCHOOL COSTS

Our school recognizes that expenses for such things as field trip costs and other school fees can cause unnecessary stress in some households. It is very important that the staff of Sacred Heart be aware of all students with life-threatening allergies. Each year the school develops an anaphylactic plan to ensure that we know who carries an epi-pen and where the epi-pen is located in the event of an emergency. At the high school level, students should carry their epi-pen with them at all times. It is also recommended that a spare emergency epi-pen be left in the main office. If you are a student who carries an epi-pen (or have any other serious medical condition) please see Mr. Kuntz to ensure that we have the information required to assist you in the event of an emergency.

Greek Salad Pitas

Serves: 4 *Preparation:* 5 minutes

Ingredients:

- 2 Whole Grain Pita Pockets
- 1 cup (250mL) cherry tomatoes (cut in half)
- 1 cup (250mL) diced cucumbers
- ½ cup (125mL) feta cheese (crumbled)
- ¼ cup (60mL) thinly sliced red onion
- ¼ cup (60mL) Greek salad dressing

Directions:

1. Cut the pitas in half.
2. Place all ingredients into a large bowl (excluding the dressing)
3. Add in Greek salad dressing and mix all ingredients together.
4. Open the pitas and stuff.
5. Pack for lunch and enjoy!

FREE ONLINE MATH HOMEWORK HELP - NOW OPEN

Back to school means the return of math homework. If you are a parent worried about how to support your child's math homework questions, don't worry! An exciting FREE online initiative designed to help students succeed is now available.

The Ministry of Education and the Independent Learning Centre has recently launched Homework Help a website for Bruce-Grey Catholic District School Board math students in grades 7 through 10.

Students simply log-on to Homework Help , at www.homeworkhelp.ilc.org and use an interactive chat room to obtain personalized tutoring from a certified Ontario math teacher. The entire session is recorded and stored in the students online locker to allow the student to review what they have learned.

TRANSPORTING EQUIPMENT ON SCHOOL BUSES

- Musical Instruments
May be transported in cases only and shall be kept on the student's lap.
- Skates
All skates transported shall have the blades suitably protected with guards and shall be tied together or be in a suitable equipment bag. The skates shall be placed on the floor at the student's feet.
- Hockey Equipment
Hockey sticks may only be transported with the approval of the school Principal and Bus Operator. Hockey equipment **may not** be transported on a school bus on a home to school route. On a charter basis, hockey equipment may be transported if it is stored in the storage space underneath the bus or inside, provided it does not block any exits or the aisle of the bus.
- Skis, Poles & Snowboards
May not be transported on a school bus on a home to school route.
- Skateboards
May not be transported on a school bus.
- Laser Pointers
May not be transported on a school bus.
- Animals
May not be transported on a school bus.
